REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

We will continue following protocols put out by the Vermont Department of Health concerning COVID restrictions.

The church continues to be without a permanent pastor, however we have not been lacking in a wonderful cast of pastors who have been filling the pulpit. We continue to have a rotation of Pastors who preach sermon and conduct the services; Pastor Joe DeWitt preaches the first Sunday of each month, Dr. Alan Ingalls preaches the second and fourth Sunday of each month, and Pastor John Brigham preaches the third and fifth Sunday of each month. We also benefit from the hospitality of pastor Richard McSherry, who conducts pastoral care and funerals. Their sermons have been bringing hope and inspiration to members through CAT-TV video recordings; you can also see these recordings on the church website. https://fbcbennington.org/

The trustees/cabinet was notified that Executive Pastor of ABC Dale Edwards will be retiring within the upcoming next year. We will continue to search for a new part-time pastor, but the search has come to a standstill, as there are few pastors in the hiring pool.

The goals of this church continue to be; budget, legal obligations, building repairs and possible options for long term use. There continues to be major building structural repairs that must be made in the upcoming year. The trustee board continues to meet every month to discuss church finances, building use, and cost sharing opportunities. Anyone who wishes to address the board may attend a meeting to discuss church business and operations.

Despite COVID-19 restrictions; the church continues to cost share with several non-profit businesses and organizations: Alcohol Anonymous-7:00 AM, Family Time (a division of PAVE), Vermont Center for Independent Living, Red Cross Blood Mobile. Colgate Hall currently has vacant office spaces available for occupancy. Cost sharing helps maintain the sustainability of the church.

Over the last few years, the board of trustees has essentially merged with the Church Life board as there are too few members to have two such boards.

The church held several rummage sales one in the summer and one in the fall; which raised money to support the work of the church.

John Harwood continues overseeing building maintenance and grounds as well as unlocking doors, closing up at night, and will be on call for safety and repairs. He will continue living in the house owned by the church, which will be compensation for his work. Tim Pinsonneault has filled the position of custodian who now cleans the Colgate building, chapel and sanctuary. The position is strictly cleaning only and will consist of 15 hours per week. For more information about this, please see the trustees.

We wish everyone a Happy New Year in 2023 and we continue to pray for the growth and prosperity of this church.
